



## Strategies for Teaching Non-Fiction: Grades 3 - 8

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### Introduction:

Welcome to *Strategies for Teaching Non-Fiction: Grades 3-8*, an online professional development course geared primarily for educators serving students in grades 3-8. The *Strategies for Teaching Non-Fiction: Grades 3-8* was developed to provide educators with various approaches to teaching non-fiction. The course discusses and supports several classroom techniques. Essentially this course teaches educators how to recognize student interests and utilize those interests to encourage reading. When students develop an interest, it is very probable that they will retain the information. Retaining the learned information will cause better grades on assessments. When this process is taught and used correctly, it will significantly impact student academic achievement.
